## Last Quarter Registers 183 Students

### HONOR ROLL

In order to obtain a place on the honor roll, a student, if he is taking 3 courses must make a minimum of 23 grade points; in order to obtain honorable mention, he must make 21 grade points.

If one is taking 2 subjects, one must make 16 grade points to obtain a place on the honor roll, and 15 points to obtain honorable mention.

Grade points are valued as follows:

A 3 points for each semester hour  
B 2 points for each semester hour  
C 1 point for each semester hour

A minus grade subtracts one point, and a plus adds one point, according to those taking 3 subjects, and those taking 2 subjects.

### News Releases

2nd Lt. Melvin E. Layne, 27, pilot of an Italy based 15th AAF B-17 Flying Fortress, has been awarded the Air Medal for "meritorious achievement while participating in aerial flight." He is the son of Mr. and Mrs. Elzie Layne of 713 Spaulding Ave., San Angelo, Texas.

Lt. Layne was graduated from San Angelo High School in 1934, and attended San Angelo College. Before enlisting in the AAF on Oct. 28, 1942, he was employed by the U.S. Post Office in San Angelo. Layne won his silver pilot's wings and was commissioned as a second lieutenant upon graduation from advanced flying school at Pecos, Tex., on April 15, 1944.

The Texas flyer flew his first combat bombing mission on January 15, 1945, against Nazi railroad yards in Vienna, Austria. Lt. Layne has flown 14 missions over enemy oil refineries, railroad yards and bridges in Germany, Austria, Hungary, Northern Italy and Czechoslovakia. He is a member of a heavy bombardment group that has flown nearly 200 missions against enemy targets in nine European countries.

Kearney received his latest decoration for "meritorious achievement" while serving as a pilot on a B-17 Flying Fortress during combat operations over enemy territory. Lt. Kearney was graduated from San Angelo High School in 1941 and was attending San Angelo College at the time of his enlistment in the air forces. He received his commission at Marfa in August, 1944, and has been overseas since November.
