Dear Father

I have received your letters about the Banking business, and am much obliged to Uncle Edmund & yourself for your kind offers. If it is carried out I think it will be the best thing that I have in prospect. The parties have decided on nothing yet however & will not probably until business opens. I think that I can sell the Linen goods here and

net 80 to 90 cts on the \$1 unless there is a greater decline than I suppose. I will have to go into the country to sell them and it will not be possible to do so until the latter part of April & May. It will keep me occupied here later unless I can sell them in large quantities. If you do not have a good offer by 1st April I think you had best send me the samples, Kahlo is anxious to

have me go into their [manuf^g] business, and wishes to give me a fuller statement of their business & what they have done since 1st Jany. If it looks desirable I will write to you
