Tomorrow is test day again. I hope that I make good grades again. I made 92 on a test in related information Wednesday.

Tomorrow afternoon I think that I will go to Oklahoma City. If I get a chance I will try to see [page 2] Joe Sanders. Mrs. Moseley sent me his address. Maybe I can get to see the lady that Mr. Davis told you about.

The fountain pen is writing all right it [sic] just me.

Yes, I go to school on Saturday. Our liberty starts at four o'clock Saturday and extends to 12 o'clock Sunday night. We get three out of four weekends off.

I have a couple of letters to write and then I have to do some studying.

How is Daddy? Did he get the Billfold I sent him for Christmas? How about aunt Annie and Granpa [sic] are they all right?

I am glad that Betty is making good grades in school. I wonder if Captian [sic] will get acquainted with the new soldiers.
