No letters from you today or yesterday either. Monday I hope that I get a lot of mail. I did get three letters from Jean today which I was glad to receive.

In my last letter I do not know if I thanked you for the stationary and candy or not but I do appreciate it as well as the one I received today. The one today had the post cards and the joke book in it.

[page 2] Today has been a funny day here, rain and wind all day long.

The Fabens boy ought to be getting home about this time. Has he been down to see you. [sic] He said that he would.

Has Betty ever decided what she is going to do? Go to school or what? How is Daddy getting along?

I am getting along all right. Tonight I will be up all night so I will close now.
