Dear Mother,

Last night I wrote to Betty in answer to her letter. I didn't hear from anyone yesterday except the Martins. Have you heard from Mrs. Martin lately. She told me that she wrote to you.

I guess Julia has been having a time coming from work and then having to cook for herself.

[page 2] There are hardly any fellows left there to be drafted are there? Most of them left are 4F's.

Thanks for sending me Iva Mae's address. The christmas which I sent to her was returned to me so she must have moved from the address I have.

The Moseley's probably will settle around Ft Wort [sic] or Houston since they have sold everything around Blanca. How is Dan Patch. [sic] You haven't said anything about captian [sic] for a long time. How is he. [sic] I wonder if he will remember me by the time I get home.

The pictures Jean and I took christmas did not come out very well so we are going to take some more.

This afternoon if the sky clears up a little. I want to take some of the snow. It snowed some more last night.

[page 3] I have some clothes to wash so I'm going to close for this time.
