I went to church at the post Chapel yesterday morning. It was full and there was some standing in the back but the chapel isn't very big and the slats are uncomfortable. The Chapelin was a good preacher.

I moved again this morning to the next barracks. I got upstairs this time and I sure like it better.

It rained here yesterday and turned cold this morning but is still



cloudy. There is one boy here from Miss. who says March is the worse month for rain and cold weather.

We are studying the the airplane electric system now. It may be pretty hard. After we finish this we go into collaboration then we have ten days is test blocks. The rest which is 20 days is working on planes. Where then on body knows. After we get in test blocks we change scaguls. They have four six hour shifts. One starts at 10'clock is the morning till 7'clock. I dont know which I will get on but I hope I'm from 7 in the morn till 6 in the afternoon but I dont guess there is a chance.
