Dear Mother,

Today I received your letters of July 1st (paper), 4th and July 6. I was very glad to receive all them of them. [sic]

I also had a couple of pictures from Lucille taken about a week after their wedding.

Ruth Harper is working at the Douglas plant in Oklahoma City. Several days ago I had a letter from the Martins. Yes they were really swell to me while I was there. I have promised Ann I would come to see her after the war and I do want to. I never did get the pictures [page 2] of her to send you. One is all I have of her.

If Joe tries he can make the school all right. I really hope he does.

I sorry [sic] both the mirrors in the compack's [sic] were broken. Cotton is very hard to find over here though.

The other letter I was speaking of should be post marked [sic] New York or Boston.

The coldness has been pretty hard on you, loosing [sic] 15 lbs. I hope you are feeling well now.

Tomorrow is my day off so I am going on liberty, and I hope I can have a good time.

I have some more letters to write so I will close now.
