

September 19, 1944

Dear Mother,

Your letters of the 7th and 8th came today. I was very glad to get them and also one from Mr. Sanders. He is a master Sargent [sic] now.

Since I came back from leave I haven't seen or heard from Jean so I really can't say. I saw her mother Saturday and hope to see her this coming Sunday.

Try to find those black leather gloves as I will need them. Something [page 2] else I need is laundry soap. For a long time we have not been able to get any here. I have face soap.

No, Mother I haven't any more money to send and put in the bank. The last \$100 USA dollars I had I put in a money order made out to myself. Don't look for me home anytime until I have 18 months out.

When did Jean McLure start wearing glasses? How is she behaving herself lately?

I'll close now as it is getting late.
