Dear Mother,

I am very sorry that I have not written to you for the last couple of days. Saturday afternoon I went into [sic] see Jean and came back Sunday night. For almost a week I haven't had any letters from you. I guess they have been holding up the mail [page 2] some place or other. I'll get it in a few days I hope.

How are Daddy and Betty? Both of them are working hard as well as yourself I imagine.

Tonight I have a twelve to four watch and about five o'clock I will probably have to go up to the field.

I do not remember if I thanked you for the package I received with some films, candy and gum in it or not. Thanks very much anyway. Now I want some good weather so that I can take some pictures. When I do I will send you some of them.

You have written to Jean haven't you. She is wanting to receive your letters. I wish you could meet her so that you would know more about her. A letter from her was the only one I had today so I had better [page 3] get busy and answer it before I go to bed.
