The reason I was changed to another crew is something I can't tell you. It doesn't exactly please me, but I guess I get by O.K. Yes, I still [sic] doing about the same things that I was at Oceana.

You ought to be getting the [illegible deletion] cards mailed in N.Y. by now as [page 2] the fellow wrote and said he mailed them.

I will write to Joe as soon as I can. James surely is getting plenty of leaves isn't he.

Last night I went in to see the little baby. She really is a cute little girl.

Here is a picture taken in the hut last week. Hope you like it.

I appreciate you [sic] advise [sic] mother and if you want to say any more do. Ruth gave me some good advise [sic] too. Her and I always tell each other our troubles.

I have to answer the other letters.
