Dear Mother,

As I received your letters of the 15, 16, 17th. Today I was very glad. I have just finished writing to Jean lettering her [sic] what you said. If I can go on liberty tomorrow I am going to see her, as it is my day off. I am glad it is as today has been a long one all ready for me.

[page 2] I won't quit writing to you mother you are still first. I too hope that things come out all right. I will do all I can to make her happy. It will probably be a little hard for her to get use [sic] to our home, but I'm sure you will do everything to make things easier. She can get out of the W.L.A. after she is married. She may stay in for awhile until things can be arranged to send her home. I really wish that we could come together when we do.
