

June 1, 1942

Dear Mama,

I got your letter today. The one written in ink and Gertrude made ice cream.

Well I started to work today in the Sub Depo (where all the airplane parts are kept). I don't know how long I will work there but it may be till the 327 Group forms. It will be better than doing anythang [sic] that comes up and I don't have to be on K.P. I work from 8 till 11:30 in the morn and 1 till 4:30 in the afternoon and have one day off each week but that may not be Sunday. I never worked hard at all today. I helped receive parts when they come in and checked them in and moved some boxes.

It's hot here again but it may be cold tomorrow.

I get paid \$26.01 and gave a dollar for soldiers relief. They take out for laundry and insurance. I never did get L.M. anythang [sic] for graduation because there is no place to get it.

Would you get him somethang [sic] and give it to him and explane [sic] why I didn't get it and why it was so late. I'm going to send some money home the first chance. I have \$47.00 now so you can take the case out of the money where I send it. Pay at least a dollar for it or more if you want to. I went to church here on the field yesterday. That is the only place to go. There are several Baptist churches in Salt Lake City but I don't know how big they are or what they are like.

Well, I guess that's all for now.
