Dear Mother,

Yesterday I received two letters from you but so far I haven't received any today, I did get one from Julia this morning.

My buddy came back from sick bay today I just saw him. He had to go get as he said, "everybody on the station to sign a slip so that he can be ~~releised~~-released from sick bay. He will probably be set back a couple of weeks in school.

Outside now it is really raining. Today we had captians [sic] inspection of the barracks. Saturday we have personal inspection out on the drill field.

In a control test today I made 85. In nomenclature & theory of flight I made 90.

[page 2] I had a letter from the Moseleys yesterday. Matt has been catching quite a few coyotes. The [sic] said that Old Dan Patch was all right.

Tomorrow, I think that we get to go over to the hanger [sic] and look over some of the planes so that we can understand some of the posts better.

Has daddy ever started working any place? How is Betty? Are granpa and Aunt Annie well. [sic]

No the Mrs. Murphy was not a U.S.O. worker. She is just a women [sic] that lets service men stay in her home on Saturday nights.

I got a letter from you. I lost Joe Sanders' address because I tore up the letter before I wrote it down.
