Dear Mother,

The last couple of days I had not had any letters from you so I hope to get some tomorrow.

How is everybody at home? Has Daddy fixed up the other car? Is Betty still working and liking it. [sic]

[page 2] You haven't been able to get any more films have you? I hope that you can get some. The past week has really been nice for taking pictures. You ought to have received another picture that I sent you by now.

The last couple of days I have been working pretty late at night. You may not be able to read the last letter I wrote to you as it was written in a great hurry. I [sic] sorry but I ~~dis~~ didn't have any more time.

The only letter I had today was from Jean. She writes almost every day. Not very much sometimes because she works very hard and is pretty tired when she get [sic] through.

I think that I will go up to the Red Cross tonight for a little while and have some coffee and donuts.

[page 3] I hope you have received the cards I spoke of being mail [sic] in the states. You ought to have because the fellow said he mailed them.

I'll say good night for now.
