Due to scheduling and cast-
ing problems, the San Angelo
Civic Theatre has cancelled its
production of the musical,
"Jacques Brel Is Alive And
Well And Living In Paris." In
its place, the theatre will pre-
sent Bill Manhoff's popular
romantic comedy, "The Owl
And The Pussycat." Perfor-
mances are scheduled for
May 22-24 and 29-31.

Readings for the play will be
held 2:30 p.m. today at the
theatre on Lake Nasworthy.
The play calls for a cast of 1
man and 1 woman, both in
their mid-to-late twenties.
Rehearsals are scheduled
begin Tuesday.

"cat" originally appeared on
Broadway in the early 60's
starring Alan Alda and the late
Diana Sands. It was made into
a hit film in 1970 starring Bar-
bra Streisand and George
Segal. Set in San Francisco,
the play tells the story of
Doris, a part-time model,
actress, and prostitute who is
thrown out of her apartment
after a complaint from a
nearby tenant.

She tracks her accuser
down, and he turns out to be a
young, uptight writer named
Felix. She moves into his
apartment with him — at first
to torment him — but as the
play progresses their relation-

Resident director Bill Logan
said, "I hated to cancel
'Brel,' but it was simply a
case of the wrong show at the
wrong time. I just couldn't cast
it to my satisfaction.

"Instead of risking an in-
ferior production with 'Brel,' I
asked the board of directors
for permission to cancel it.

"Our schedule over the next
four months is incredibly tight.
I felt I didn't have adequate re-
hearsal time for a musical. We
plan now to schedule next sea-
son's musical in the fall."
