

November 9, 1943

Dear Mother,

I have just finished taking a show [sic] and eating chow since I came back from Dam Neck. I have had two days down there. It is going to last for three weeks. It is more or less the same thing as we did at Purcell except that now they have a different method of finding the range and speed.

Yesterday I received a letter from Mary Virginia. She [illegible deletion] seems to be getting along fine. She said she might come home christmas.

I hope that Betty's class does make a lot of money off of their war bond sale. How is she getting along in school. [sic]

[page 2] Yes, I guess that it was a rather lonesome birthday for Thelma Lee. I haven't heard from Jackie since he has been back to San Diego.

When Mary Nevell come home again tell her that she owes me a letter. I ~~am~~ am glad that Jean is getting along fine.

It is still raining here. Not today but yesterday it rained and last night.

Tonight is my duty night so I had better get down to the hangar and muster.
