

May 24, 1945

Dear Mother,

The wedding was really nice [illegible deletion] day before yesterday mother. I wish that you and Daddy could have been there. Jean really looked lovely in her orster [sic] satin gown with a long train. Charlie (Chuck) Knoch was best man. Her Uncle Archie gave her away. Ten of the fellows were there besides a lot of her relatives and other friends. The photographer took some pictures so I am hoping [page 2] they come out good. It was running [sic] when we left the church being showered with connfettie [sic]. Two taxies [sic] ran shuttle ..... from the church to home where we had a big party. The top tear [sic] of the cake will be brough [sic] home. I will get you the clipping out of the paper.

I am in some ..... though for some reason the town is restricted so I can go see her. The allotment is fixed up. We received £36 in all. I made out a money order to her for it so she can save it.
