Jean is liking her new place of work O.K. and says that she has the good fortune of being billeted with a very nice family.

Tomorrow I am going to town, go swimming, see Jean's mother and probably go to a show as it is my day off. I hope that it is a nice warm day, but from the past few days I'm afraid that it won't be.

[page 2] How are Daddy and Betty? Did she get the money order all right? School will be out by the time this reaches you.

A good while ago I sent some pictures of some of the fellows in a letter. Have you received them. [sic] They were taken while I was away to [sic] London.

I hope that every one [sic] is well and not having to work too hard.
