position at San Marcos doing about the same things

 Keep that chin up. Millions of love and kisses.

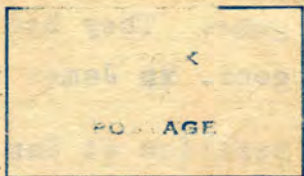
