Dear Betty,

Your letter came yesterday but I I would wait until today to answer it as I wrote to mother yesterday. Mothers letter of the 18th came this afternoon.

Jean and I are married now and very happy. We did have a hard time finding things for the wedding. It was very nice though. Tomorrow is my liberty night but I don't know if I will be able to see her or not as the town where she lives is out of bounds until further notice. I hope that it is lifted [page 2] before tomorrow afternoon.

I do hope Jean will be home when the peaches are ripe but I can't say. We are going to London as soon as we can get the chance to do so. There are a lot of things to be done before I can send her home. You are going to like her though.

Did mother sent [sic] that letter I asked her for saying she would take care of Jean.
