Dear Mr. Herring:

I have just received a letter from Mr. J. W. Cole, Acting Second Assistant Postmaster General, relative to an extension of rural route from San Angelo, reading in part as follows:

"In February, 1940, the postmaster at that office recommended that rural route No. 2 be extended to what is known as the Scherz community, a thickly-settled district about 10 miles southeast of San Angelo. This matter was investigated by an inspector, and he recommended an extension involving 8.05 miles of additional travel to provide improved mail delivery to approximately 40 families.

"This extension has been tentatively approved by the Department, but we are not in a position to state just when the new service will be authorized, as we have on hand a large number of cases which were approved prior to this one."
