Dear Mother,

Yesterday I received your letter of February 25th and today the one of the 24th that you wrote to Jean and I both. Saturday when I go in to see her I will take it. She is going to be as well as I all ready am glad that you are getting some things ready for us. It will help out so much. I have to get some one [sic] to quilt the top that Aunt Nettie gave me and also have Jean put the bed spread together that I started. She will probably want to get some kind of a job after she is there and acquainted. Something you had better get for her is some tea. She doesn't like coffee and drinks her tea hot with cream. That is something that I have learn [sic] [page 2] to like over here. I think that she has written to you again mother.

Tomorrow I will try to get time to write to Betty. I should have last night but I didn't have time.

Today is been cold again. This weather is surely changeable, but I'm about use [sic] to it by now.
