

A 58 takes PAGA event

There were so many Pan American Golf Association players at the San Angelo Riverside Golf Course on Sunday, PAGA tournament director Pete Guebara had to divide the one-day tournament into a morning and afternoon event.

More than 75 four-man teams from around Texas and the country participated in the national tourney. The team of George Ybara (Odessa), Billy Weatherall (Levelland), Albert Delado (San Angelo) and Raymond Flores (Midland) fired a 58 to win the afternoon event.

The morning tournament was captured by Ron Tenorio (Lubbock), Mike Rent (El Paso), Hector Cantu (San Marcos) and Eddie Esparza Jr. (Oklahoma City) with an 18-hole total of 61.

A host of teams finished with 65s to tie for second, third, fourth and fifth during the morning competition. The afternoon team of Victor Villarreal (Abilene), Al Cardenas (San Angelo), Johnny Mioya (San Angelo) and Joe Lopez (Odessa) hit a nifty 61 to finish second. J.D. Reyes (San Angelo), Richard Moreno (Lubbock), Gilbert Villarreal (Abilene) and Lee Saenz (Austin) shot a 62 to place third.

The women's event was won on Saturday. Eloise Gonzales (San Angelo), Lily Serna (El Paso) and Ruth Gonzales (El Paso) were that team. The men's event was the culmination of the three-day PAGA Winter Meetings.
