

August 27, 1945

Dear Mary,

I got your two letters one written July 17 and one with Aug. 17 both today as well as a letter from Gertrude written Aug 19 and a card from Waldene written July 17. The last letter I got from Mary was written Aug. 18th.

Today is the first pretty day we have had in a long time so all the airplanes out out taking pictures. Most of them made two trips. They may not get to take this many pictures in several weeks. If this weather keeps up we will be finished in a few days but that don't mean we will go home but there won't be much to do that I can see but I guess they can find plenty for us to do.

This is the third letter I have written in less that [sic] two weeks so I don't know much news.

Which store is Robert working at?

Will Richard be getting out of the Navy. [sic] He should have little enough time to get out. I told you I hope to be home by the first of the year but I didn't say which year. The army treats everyone so fair. The first in the last out [sic]. The first overseas the last home [sic].

Has Fred Sharp got home yet? What ever happened to Earnest Marrow. [sic] Is she still in the states [sic].

I will close because I don't' know any news.
